

The B & W photo above shows The 'West End', still undeveloped. The Cambria Inn, known previously as the Three Tuns Inn, Porthaethwy Ferry House (until 1839),

The Packet Inn and now the Cambria dominates the scene (large white building in the Centre). The Porthaethwy Ferry is first referred to in 1193. The Foundry, where the support cables for the Suspension Bridge were made, is the large grey building to the right of the picture.

The Cambria is now a private house and the Foundry has been made into flats (originally threatened with demolition).

The photos above are part of the Society's Photo Archive and were used in the talk before Christmas. Taken from round about Bodlondeb on the mainland they show the view the Davies Family would had have of their shipping and warehouse businesses. Photos of the Town and the area are always welcome. **BARDS** Richard Llwyd, also known as The Bard of Snowdon (1752 – 29 December 1835), was a Welsh author, poet and expert on Welsh heraldry and genealogy. His most notable work is *Beaumaris Bay*, was published in 1800 and revised in 1832. A wonderfully exuberant work in the florid style of its time it described not only Beaumaris Bay but parts of Gwynedd as well. His comments on the Suspension Bridge are prescient ".... And the wish of ages, and of nations, is accomplished and the wonder a few years hence will be, not that it is done\*, but that it was so long undone; for the wealth and industry of a country is no way more rationally employed than in the promotion of and .... the consequent interchange of its produce......

Richard was born at the King's Head in Beaumaris, went

to Beaumaris Free School (later Beaumaris Grammar School) and made an honorary member of the Cymmrodorian Society. His name was recognised, I believe, as one of the named 'houses' in the old Beaumaris Grammar School.

Cynan, a founder of the Civic Trust for Wales, who lived by the pier in Menai Bridge for many years, wrote of the nature of 'power' in his poem on the opening of the Gas Grid at Menai Bridge/Llanfair PG in 1957. The marble stone inscribed with his poetry has now nearly all been eroded away. A disgrace to his memory and work. We cannot afford to lose the work of such greats and their insight is till just as relevant today. (See Cynan's poem on page 3).

#### WHERE WAS IT?



In the publicity for our last meeting we issued the photo above, dated 1897, to see if anyone could recognise where it was. One or two made a good guess - it's the road to Beaumaris just before you get to Plas Rhianfa. The old photo from the Davies' Album shows the footbridge from one side of the road to the other, linking the grounds of Craig y Don. The road was widened in 1924 and the footbridge removed or do you have any better information about the date?



Craig y Don has been built upon, added to and modernised many times over the past 400 years but still retained its Grade 2 listed status for special features e.g. clock tower. It was the former home of Twm Chwarateg, multi millionaire and controller of much of the production of copper in the eighteenth century. A sensitive restoration project is underway making it a home/ holiday let. The proposal to rename the property Menai Hall, while work is carried out, seems most unusual; surely its original name shouldn't be lost?

# **BRIDGE'S BICENTENARY** 1826—2026

The Bridge's 200th Birthday is in 2026. Seems like a long way off but will soon be with us and time is needed to plan community events. The Town Council, Rhun ap Iorwerth AS/MS and Menai Bridge Community Heritage Trust have, together, called a meeting on Monday 15th January 2024 in Ysgol David Hughes, starting at 6.30 p.m., to start discussing and planning ideas to celebrate. Our Newsletter in January last year monitored the sad state of the maintenance of the Suspension Bridge. It is noted that The Welsh Government's report about the work was updated in December 2023 and states, "Works to replace the bridge hangers started on 4 September 2023. Other essential work to bring the bridge back into full use are also taking place. The construction programme has been developed by UK Highways A55 Ltd. They operate and maintain the bridge on behalf of the Welsh Government through a Private Finance Initiative (PFI) Design, Build, Finance and Operate (DBFO) Contract. The plans have been discussed with stakeholders...... It is expected that all the required works will be completed by the end of August 2025 (subject to weather).

This will ensure the Menai Suspension Bridge is ready for its 200th anniversary in 2026. "

Without wanting to be too cautious or cynical perhaps the first thing the Meeting could do is ask for regular reports on the progress of the 'required works' and just what the timetable is?
